School Farm of the Year Awards encourage the next generation



Blue Skies is encouraging the next generation of agricultural entrepreneurs after crowning the winners of its 2019 School Farm of the Year Competition in Ghana.

The School Farm Competition of the Year Competition was launched by the Blue Skies Foundation in 2015 as a way of encouraging more young people to take an interest in farming, and to help raise the profile of agriculture. In the competition, schools are required to setup and manage their own 'School Farms' and submit business plans to ensure their sustainability. Teams of inspectors made up of agricultural experts visit the participating schools periodically to assess their performance and ultimately determine the winners.

Over 1,000 students attended this years award ceremony representing sixty schools who participated in the 2019 competition. This year the SHS School Farm of the Year was awarded to Akwamuman Senior High School, Asokore (pictured below), and the JHS School Farm of the Year was awarded to Damang School.

Helping the community to reduce plastic pollution

In Siyathemba, the community near our factory in South Africa, the local waste site had over the years got in to a bad state. Plastics were strewn all over the fence and were polluting the nearby area, and animals had been able to enter unfenced areas and become affected by consuming waste plastic materials. As a responsible member of the community, Blue Skies took action by working with its local contractor and



the local environmental department to clean up the site and clear it of all plastics. Blue Skies SA Maintenance Manager, China Mokoena, coordinated the project and has put in place measures to ensure that the site is no longer used for dumping plastics. Plastic materials are now directed to a local recycling enterprise. As a result, the waste site is now looking a lot more tidy and the local community and animals are no longer affected by plastic pollution. This is a great example of our people taking the initiative and working with the local community to solve a problem.

Our Blueprint Action Groups are just getting going, and in 2020 we will feature regular updates of what our Action Groups are doing across the group. Our Pitsford Action Group has been going now since January 2019 and in that time it has already achieved a lot. In the last twelve months the group has instigated a number of actions, including:

- Introducing recycling bins Bringing in dual toilet flushes to reduce water consumption

- Introducing Mindulness sessions to help with stress relief.
- Replacing the dishwasher with a new energy efficient model.
- Providing 'Happy to Share' labels to encourage people to share food in order to reduce food waste.
