## Blue Skies gives over 41k meals to Felix Project



Earlier this year, Blue Skies partnered the Felix Project to redistribute surplus fruit to charities and schools. Felix's Site Supply Coordinator, Katie Pope, explains the impact that this has had so far...

'The Felix Project is so pleased to be partnered with Blue Skies. Since the start of our collaboration in September this year, 17,458kg has been kindly donated which is the equivalent of 41,565 meals! The Felix Project rescues good quality surplus from the food industry that cannot be sold and would otherwise go to waste. We then sort the supplies and redistribute it to those in need including homeless hostels, community kitchens, women's refuge centres, services for the elderly, foodbanks and schools in deprived areas across London. Our food partners, such as Blue Skies, enable us to continue our mission of getting good quality, nutritious supplies to people in need by making use of surplus in the UK's food supply, saving it from becoming waste and harming the planet. # Will you make personal pledge for the planet?

This month, Carrie Starkings encourages us to think about the choices we each can make to reduce our impact on the climate...



We have been living and working through unprecedented times over the past 2 years with the pandemic and increasing numbers of natural disasters. With the United Nations Climate Change conference wrapping up last month it got me thinking about all of the impacts that we as individuals have on the plant. Not only in our working lives but our personal lives too.

I have made a personal pledge along with my family to change practices, make wiser choices and question the 'norm' to make the planet a better place. This starts at home with small changes, changing the types of light bulbs we use in the house, buying only what we need and could not grow ourselves, not to support fast fashion, changing purchase habits to refill and recycle rather than increasing landfill, pass on/donate toys and books that have been outgrown, participating in community tree planting projects, etc.

As a family we have also done research into internet search engines, finding out which ones are powered by alternative energies and emitt less carbon to produce the search results. The research is interesting and as a family we have settled to use Ekoru as our internet search engine of choice, there are many options on the market but this one is the best fit for us. Ekoru are powered by sustainable hydro power, where the alternatives are mixed power sources and produce only 0.1g CO2 for a search (vs 2.46g of CO2 for Google), they also clean up the oceans and replant seagrasses.
