# Blue Skies calls for urgent action to help UK food industry in crisis

Blue Skies have written to the government asking for urgent action to support the food industry as it faces the 'Perfect Storm' of COVID-19 restrictions, immigration policy and tax reform. All three issues are already impacting the ability of food suppliers and hauliers to transport their products and recruit the necessary labour to keep retailers supplied. Pelican News reported back in July 2020 how concerns about the UK government's immigration policy would lead to labour shortages. These fears have now materialised and, compounded with the continuing instability of freight routes, threaten to do serious long-term damage to the UK food and beverage sector. CEO, Hugh Pile, said "We have been struck by the sheer number of companies in our sector that are being forced to scale back their operations and reduce supplies to UK retailers. Unless something is done soon, it will start to have a noticeable impact on availability in stores, something which we are pulling out all the stops to avoid".

She said the opportunity given to her by Blue Skies after the completion of her tertiary education has helped her tremendously. Portia has stayed with Blue Skies for over 3 years, and her the job has not just accelerated her professional growth but her personal growth as well.

Among a tall list of newly acquired experiences, she has developed real appreciation for team work which she says may never have been possible without the support from our inclusive and seamless society.

Shedding more light on her experiences, Portia acknowledges that though she entered Blue Skies as a certified electrical engineer, she is now a fully trained engineer. Over the years, she has also acquired knowledge and potent skills in both mechanical and civil engineering.

For Portia, seeing more women like her in her field of work will boost her morale, understanding that her own growth has been made possible because of the opportunities Blue Skies offers women. She is inspired by the achievements of women in key leadership positions at Blue Skies and has urged the younger ones to persevere and ask for help when in need. "People are willing to help if only you ask for it" she says.

Portia believes the involvement of women can be heightened by the government through youth-centred initiatives while acknowledging that women are at a greater advantage in the engineering field. "Women should strive more, push, ask without fear. If there is fear you can't achieve what you want to achieve. It applies to everyone" she adds.

Portia is part of the few who have benefited from last year's Industrial Control Systems Training with Aytech Power and Control Systems Limited (APCS), a training which was sponsored by Blue Skies Ghana. She says the hands-on practical training was a chance accorded to her to improve herself.
