Blue Skies has signed up to the UK Food Waste Reduction Roadmap and have committed to implementing WRAP's "Target, Measure, Act" in to our UK operations. As part of our Blueprint, our ultimate aim is to achieve zero waste to landfill. With WRAP we have targeted a 30% reduction in Food Waste by 2025.

#### **South Africa celebrates Heritage Day**




